SEWER CAPACITY

Though there is a main sewer transmission line on the property, the city wanted additional sewer capacity for industrial growth. The City of Pikeville is addressing this with the new state-of-the-art, \$22 million sewer plant. The city has secured all funds necessary to construct the sewer plant. The project will be completed in 2019. This will be the first eco-friendly membrane sewer system in the state of Kentucky. The new plant will allow the city to double its current capacity to 4 million gallons with room to triple, if needed quickly, by simply adding additional membranes in the same footprint to accommodate the city's future growth.

BRIDGE

The City of Pikeville was successful in receiving an \$8 million grant to construct a new industrial bridge to the site. The bridge has direct access from U.S. 23 to the entrance to the industrial park. The bridge project was completed in November 2016.

GAS

Natural gas transmission lines are currently accessible throughout the park.

POWER

Power lines are installed throughout the park by Kentucky Power to meet current and future loads.

BROADBAND

There are currently multiple options for phone or high speed broadband with plans to provide gigabyte service by 2018 to the site.

ROAD

A new industrial standard road was constructed in 2015. The park is now accessible by two entrances. One is using the newly constructed bridge, which created direct access to U.S. 23 and the additional road is the old Marion Branch road off of U.S. 23. Both entrances provide access to the asphalted road, which was also widened to suit the needs of industrial traffic of the park.

WATER

There are currently two water tanks located on the site. A newly constructed 1 million gallon tank was completed in 2016 and a existing 300,000 gallon tank. The 1 million gallon tank would also act as a feeder for the 300,000 gallon tank. This will provide plenty of capacity for the industrial park, while also being able to be used as a back up system, if needed.

SERVICE LINES


New high capacity industry standard water/sewer transmission lines are installed and extend through the entire park. This project was completed in 2016.

RAIL SERVICE

Current rail yard is within 2 miles of the site. However, there is a previously dismantled rail spur at the entrance of the park that can be reactivated as needed.




2. Proposed Lot Layout Map





3. Infrastructure Map





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
4. Topography Map

Payroll Grant — Kentucky Business Investment (KBI) Program

This grant provides 5 percent of gross wages for up to 15 years for qualifying projects (10-plus new jobs, capital investment of at least \$100,000, average wage of at least \$9.06/hour plus benefits of an additional 15 percent)

Corporate Tax Rebate — Kentucky Business Investment (KBI) Program

This credit can provide up to 100 percent of corporate income or limited liability entity tax arising from a project. The company may collect up to 100 percent of initial investment over a 15 year period of time as a credit against state corporate taxes.

Sales and Use Tax Refund — Kentucky Enterprise Initiative Act (KEIA)

For new or expanding projects, KEIA provides a refund of Kentucky sales and use tax paid by approved companies for building and construction materials permanently incorporated as an improvement to real property. KEIA is also available for Kentucky sales and use tax refunds for eligible equipment.

Real Estate Grant

We understand the need for your project to reduce start-up costs and are open to working on a mutually beneficial deal to get your project running and profitable as quickly as possible. Local Government entities will consider low-cost or free lease/sale transactions on property, existing buildings and/or build-to-suit for qualifying projects based on the number of jobs, wages and total investment dollars. These incentives are negotiable with Regional Industrial Development Authorities and Local Municipalities on publicly owned properties and are considered on a project-by-project basis.

Workforce Training Incentives

By utilizing Kentucky's College System, new industry may qualify for up to 100% of eligible training costs associated with the hiring of new employees. The KCTCS-Trains program offers customizable workforce and industry training to relocating or expanding companies. Additional workforce incentives and grants are available through the Bluegrass State Skills Corporation.

OJT Funding

Through our regional group, Eastern Kentucky Concentrated Employment Program (EKCEP), federal On-The-Job Training Funds may be used to cover up to 50% of new employee wages for a period of up to six months. This program provides significant payroll savings while putting our highly skilled laborers back into the workforce. This program is considered on a case-by-case basis and is not guaranteed.







KENTUCKYWIRED

There are currently multiple options for phone or high speed broadband with plans to provide gigabyte service by mid-2017 to the Kentucky Enterprise Industrial Park and the City of Pikeville.

Fast, reliable broadband internet is a necessity in the business world now. Businesses, both large and small, need to have access to product orders, company headquarters, inventories, and other information 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Business in our community will be able to compete globally with faster broadband speeds. Fast and dependable broadband is an economic lifeline paving the way to increased job creation, education, and health access.

KentuckyWired is a new, statewide project recommended by the SOAR (Shaping Our Appalachian Region) initiative. This will bring fast broadband to every county in the state, beginning in Eastern Kentucky. With the KentuckyWired project, Pikeville and Eastern Kentucky are breaking down the geographic and financial barriers to connect our community globally, allowing greater access to education, healthcare, and economic development.

The Eastern Kentucky region (this includes Pikeville, Kentucky) will be the first priority area, with work beginning in the summer of 2015. The backbone work is expected to be completed in Pikeville by April of 2017.

The KentuckyWired project is estimated to total \$324 million. The funding will be provided by both federal and state levels, as well as the private sector.

This project is the largest P3 fiber partnership in the country and the only one which is fully open-access.


The city has signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the state of Kentucky to become the first gigabyte community in the state.

The City of Pikeville continues to work through the various stages of our broadband strategy for the community. We are working on the most effective way to take full advantage of the state's project. CTC, one of the nation's leading experts in developing a broadband strategy, completed a full feasibility study in 2016 to assist and guide Pikeville on constructing our last mile. This will improve current healthcare and education sectors, while also assisting Pikeville in diversifying our economy with the latest, greatest, affordable, and high speed broadband service. This will create a virtual presence and connect Pikeville globally. Funding is committed by the City of Pikeville to implement the first phase and launch of the project. The city intends to select its partner through a Request for Proposal process in early 2017, whoever is selected will assist the city in the designing, engineering, construction, and operation of the new system. The city intends on implementing and operating a full open access network by the end of 2018.

Property Tax	Upon all real estate within the city not specifically exempted from taxation situated within the city, an amount of \$0.15 per \$100.00 of assessed value.
	A tax upon all tangible personal property and franchises, not specifically exempted from taxation, a tax of \$0.15 per \$100.00 of assessed value.
Tax Rate for Abandoned Urban Properties	The rate of taxation levied upon abandoned urban properties is \$1.50 on each \$100.00 of assessed value.
Occupational License Tax	Every person or business entity engaged in any business for profit and any person or business entity that is required to make a filing with the Internal Revenue Service or the Kentucky Revenue Cabinet shall be required to file and pay to the city an occupational license tax for the privilege of engaging in such activities within the city. The occupational license tax shall be measured by 2%.
Discount	A discount of 2% of the total amount of the tax bill is hereby allowed upon bills paid on or before November 1, 2016.
	The face amount of tax without discount or penalty shall be due for tax bills that are paid after November 1, 2016 through January 1, 2017.
Transient Room Tax	3% transient room tax.
Eastern Kentucky Expo Center Tax	A tax is hereby imposed upon all person, companies or corporations doing business within Pike County, Kentucky as motor courts, motels, hotels, inns or similar accommodation businesses at the rate of 1% of gross receipts derived from the rental and occupancy of suite, room or rooms.
Restaurant Tax	The retail sale of all food and beverages by a restaurant located within the municipal limits of the city a tax equal to 3% of the gross amount of each sale (excluding any other tax). This tax may or may not be passed on to the ultimate customer/consumer at the discretion of the restaurant.
Alcoholic Beverage Tax	There is imposed a regulatory license fee upon the gross receipts from sale of alcoholic beverages of each establishment within the city licensed to sell alcoholic beverages, by packages or by drink, in the sum of 3% of the gross receipts of such establishments.
Coal Taxes	In addition to any other taxes, fee, licenses, and payments imposed by law, operations of facilities for the loading and unloading of coal, sand, gravel, or a combination thereof which have a site within the corporate limits of the city, shall be required to pay a minimum license defer to the city of \$.10 per ton for each and every ton of that substance processed.

TRANSPORTATION

With Interstate-quality highways and the Pike County Regional Airport, the City of Pikeville has quite literally moved mountains to open us up to commerce, retail, industry, and more. The Cut-Through Project (completed in 1987) moved a river and mountain to open Pikeville up for quality roads and access while also protecting the city from flooding. The New York Times called it the "Eighth Wonder of the World" and it is the second largest civil engineering project in the Western Hemisphere, behind the Panama Canal. This project is a true testament to ingenuity and determination of Pikeville and its people.

Pikeville, Kentucky is in a unique position in Eastern Kentucky because we are the intersection of four interstate-quality highways – U.S. 23, U.S. 119, U.S. 80, and U.S. 460. It is one of the busiest rural intersections in the state with over 38,000 cars that pass through daily.

- > We are in close proximity to rail yards, including CSX's Shelby Yard which is only 2.5 miles from the Kentucky Enterprise Industrial Park.
- > At the Cassidy Boulevard intersection in Pikeville, we have a service area of 217,000 people and 500,000 people living within a 50 mile radius.
- Within 600 miles of Pikeville, one is capable of reaching 51% of the U.S. population, 48% of personal income in the United States, and 55% of manufacturing employment in the U.S. as well. We are in a prime location for any and all types of businesses and industry.





With the University of Pikeville, Big Sandy Community & Technical College, and Pikeville Independent Schools we are improving our community and our future by educating both the current workforce and the younger generations.

UNIVERSITY OF PIKEVILLE

Having a university such as UPIKE, right in the heart of downtown Pikeville, is an asset. Since becoming a university in 2011, enrollment has increased to more than 2,000 students. Pikeville is being permeated with educated individuals more than ever. An emphasis on the importance of education can be seen with growth of the campus itself. In 2012, a \$34 million educational facility, the Coal Building, was added to campus. The new Kentucky College of Optometry Health Professions Education Building is completed. The University of Pikeville is built on a broad liberal arts foundation that focuses on independent thinking, preparation for leadership, and civic responsibility. UPIKE offers 24 undergraduate majors, 4 pre-professional programs, two masters programs and two doctoral programs.

Coleman College of Business

Masters of Business Administration is offered through the college. The program cultivates an academic entrepreneurial business mindset with dedicated, experienced professors, and specialized training. The college also hosts a business plan competition open to all Eastern Kentucky residents that promotes entrepreneurship in Central Appalachia.

A new 103,000 sq. ft. building with a stateof-the-art learning and teaching space has completed construction and is one of two schools in the nation that teaches laser as a scope of practice. PIKEVILLE MEDICAL CENTER

Pikeville Medical Center (PMC) is a superior, 261 bed hospital with patient clinics around the community that provide more than 400 services.

PMC has been nationally recognized as a leader in healthcare and received many awards for the exemplary services they provide. PMC will be expanding their facilities with a more than \$140 million expansion that will make an additional 39 beds available, with 29 of them being used for the Intensive Care Unit. This brings the total number of beds available to 300. Also, this expansion will include a complete renovation of the cardiac cath lab and the cardiac rehabilitation center.

Trauma Services

24/7 trauma care led by experienced professionals in trauma, neurosurgery, orthopedic trauma, critical care, and emergency transportation services. Some trauma services include (but not limited to) treatment of gunshot wounds, burns, motor vehicle and industrial accidents. PMC's Trauma Center is verified as a Level II Trauma Center. It is the only level II trauma center in Kentucky. They can handle almost all critical care emergencies in Pikeville.

Leonard Lawson Cancer Center

The Cancer Center is a full service facility that is staffed by expert oncologists and nurses providing state-of-the-art cancer treatment. It offers radiation therapy 7 days a week, on-site biopsies and surgical services, and radiation oncology. PMC made an investment of \$10 million to purchase two RapidArc linear accelerators to treat cancer patients two to eight times faster than conventional forms of radiotherapy.

Heart Institute

PMC's Heart Institute has the most advanced cardiac equipment and technologies available in Kentucky. PMC was the first hospital in Kentucky to offer 4D imaging by GE Vivid Dimensions 7 echocardiogram system. The Institute offers heart services including open heart surgery, stent and pacemaker placements, coronary artery bypass grafting, and many others.

Community Outreach

PMC feels a great responsibility to improve the health and lives of our community. They sponsor many activities such as blood drives, free screenings, free health fairs, Meals on Wheels, and more. PMC continues to make a great impact on our community and their well-being.

FULL SERVICE CITY Emergency Responders

Safety is not only a basic need, but a top priority for the City of Pikeville. Establishing ourselves as a safe place to live, work, and raise a family relies on our committed police and fire department. We are a full-service city with outstanding police officers, firemen, EMTs, and 911 dispatchers. They all have a sense of duty and dedication to the community of Pikeville and all work together to make this city as safe as can be.

PIKEVILLE POLICE DEPARTMENT

The Pikeville Police Department consists of a force of fully trained and certified officers and is structured into 3 divisions along with specialized units. It is considered one of the best departments statewide. The Pikeville Police Department was awarded a 5 year KACP Law Enforcement Accreditation. Each officer continually exceeds the minimum amount of training required each year. The department holds certifications from the Department of Criminal Justice Training in many areas. Some of these include: Crisis Intervention, Precision Rifle, Police Canine, Criminal Investigation, Community Policing, and Rapid Deployment (response to active shooter incidents/mass casualties). Pikeville Police Department is one of only a handful departments in the state that has a trained Rapid Deployment Coordinator. They average less than a 4 minute response time in the city. Along with the City Police, Pikeville also has a Kentucky State Police Post and and the Pike County Sheriff's Department is also headquartered in downtown Pikeville. This also adds to the insurance of safety in and around the city.

911 CENTER

The 911 Center also aids in the safety and protection of our community with 24/7 service communication including cellular 911 service within the city limits. It is a state-of-the-art system with state-certified employees who have all been trained through the Kentucky Department of Criminal Justice. They are an integral part in keeping a quick response time.

PIKEVILLE FIRE DEPARTMENT

The Pikeville Fire Department has a full staff of career fire fighters, who are also certified EMT's, working 24 hours a day and 7 days a week. Our fire department is also supported by volunteer fire fighters. Recently our fire department lowered our ISO rating to a 2. There are three separate fire station locations within the city, we have a fire station within five miles of all the city's corporate boundaries, which helps us tremendously reduce our fire departments response time. Station 1, which is considered the headquarters, is located at Chloe Road. Station 1 is responsible for downtown Pikeville. Station 3 is located on Hambley Boulevard that mans the northern city limits, and Station 2 is located on Island Creek Road, which is very close to the Kentucky Enterprise Industrial Park. Breaks Interstate Park Virginia

A beautiful, 4,600 acre park that stretches over Kentucky and Virginia. It is known as the "Grand Canyon of the South" for its 5-mile gorge that is the deepest east of the Mississippi River. There are 25 miles of trails in the park as well as mountain biking trails, horseback riding, fishing, boating, and white water rafting. The park has 2 lakes, a river, a water park, and an 18-hole golf course. For lodging, the park offers an 81-room lodge overlooking the gorge, lake front cabins, and cottages to rent. For those wanting to bring their own lodging, the Breaks offers a 138-site campground for tents and RVs.

Fishtrap Lake State Park Pike County

A beautiful 1,131 acre man made lake that is used as flood control for the Ohio and Big Sandy Rivers. The park provides many opportunities for boating, fishing, hiking, playgrounds, and shelters for large gatherings.

Jenny Wiley State Park Presotnsburg

The Jenny Wiley State Resort Park offers a variety of recreational activities including boating, fishing, theatre, camping, golfing, hiking, and many others. Jenny Wiley State Resort Park has 1,100 acres around Dewey Lake that showcases the beautiful waters and mountain areas.

Kingdom Come State Park Harlan County

With an elevation of 2,700 ft. Kingdom Come State Park shows several amazing rock formations throughout the park, including Log Rock, a natural sandstone bridge, and Raven Rock, a giant rock exposure that soars 290 feet into the air at a 45-degree angle.

Hatfield and McCoy ATV Trails West Virginia

The Hatfield and McCoy Trails is an all-terrain vehicle (ATV), dirt bike, and utility terrain vehicle (UTV) trail that goes through nine Southern West Virginia counties. The trail systems are open all year and connects into many communities in West Virginia that are "ATV Friendly."
